



MY Post STEM Activity: Flying Birds

Can you make paper birds fly using a balloon? Use the power of static electricity to magically pick up paper and move it around.

Follow the steps below to make the flying birds:

- 1. Use markers to draw a few birds on tissue paper and cut them out with scissors.
- 2. Lay the paper birds on a flat surface.
- 3. Blow up a balloon and tie it off at the end.
- 4. Rub the balloon on wool cloth or on your hair for 10 to 20 seconds.
- 5. Hold the balloon a few inches above the paper birds. See if you can make them fly without touching them!





<u>Materials:</u>

Markers
Scissors
Party balloon
Wool cloth

The interesting fact!

When a balloon is rubbed with wool cloth, electrons are transferred from the cloth to the balloon. This gives the balloon an overall negative charge. Even though the paper has a neutral charge, the charges within it can rearrange so that a positively charged area is attracted by the negatively charged balloon.

jelly beans, or mini cookies!




